- / Include:
 - an **introduction** that includes your name

(2 – 3 sentences)

(3 points)

• 3 important facts with explanations

(3- 4 sentences **per** fact)

(9 Points)

• a career that relates to your topic

(2-3 sentences which includes education, salary, and how it is

beneficial to your topic area)

(6 points)

• a **conclusion** (2-3 sentences)

(3 points)

- ✓ Make a poster or Tri-fold with LARGE text and pictures (2 points)
- ✓ <u>Time yourself!</u> Your presentation should be at least

3 minutes - 4 minutes MAXIMUM!
